### 2017-2018 Bridges Magis Program Begins September 16

### Arturo Sosa, S.J. (1948- )

Following the resignation of Adolfo Nicolás, S.J., as Superior General of the Society of Jesus in 2016, 212 Jesuit electors from across the world met in Rome on October 14 of that year to elect his successor. Their choice was 67-year-old Venezuelan Arturo Sosa Abascal, S.J., who became the first Latin-American leader of the Society since its foundation in 1540. He is the organization's 31st Superior General.

Fr. Sosa was born in Caracas, Venezuela, on November 12, 1948. He speaks Spanish, Italian, and English as well as understanding French, and holds a doctorate in Political Sciences from the Universidad Central de Venezuela.

The first Latin-American leader of the Jesuits has a background that is curiously similar to that of Jorge Mario Bergoglio, S.J. who is currently serving as Pope Francis, the first Jesuit pope.

Fr. Sosa was in charge of the Jesuit-run social and action research center, known as the Centro Gumilla. He also headed the social apostolate of the Jesuits in Venezuela, a role in which his duties included the very large Jesuit school network, Fe y Alegría, which primarily serves the poor.

Arturo Sosa was Venezuelan provincial of the Society of Jesus from 1996 to 2004. Dictator Hugo Chávez was in place during much of Sosa's time working in Venzuela, creating a great deal of hostitlity and tension in the nation. Sosa has described the authoritarian regime of Chávez's successor Nicolás Maduro as a "popular tyranny."

Fr. Sosa has taught political science in a number of different institutes and colleges, was rector of the Catholic University of Táchira and a member of the founding board of the Andrés Bello Catholic University in Caracas. He also served as a visiting professor at the Latin-American Studies Center of Georgetown University in 2004.

From 2014 until his appointment as Superior General two years later he worked as the Delegate of the General for the International houses and Works of the Society of Jesus in Rome, a post that made him responsible for Jesuit formation and other houses, including the Jesuit headquarters or General Curia, as well as the Gregorian University, the Pontifical Biblical Institute, the Pontifical Oriental Institute and the Vatican Observatory.

Although many of his thirty predecessors who have led the Jesuits have had beards, Fr. Sosa is one of very few who have a moustache.
